Greetings to the Williamsport District UMW:

As we approach the end of August, I am sure that many of you are gearing up to have your units become more active. Vacations will be over and along with our young people our days become more structured.

As of now we have paid approximately 42% of our pledge to conference. Since we are a little over half way through the year, we still have some work to do. I just want to remind you to keep working on it, as I am sure that we are going to be able to make this goal.

I also want to encourage each unit to become a Five Star Unit for the year by giving in the first 5 categories: Pledge to Mission, Special Mission Recognition (minimum-1 pin - \$40), Gift to Mission (minimum-\$5), Gift in Memory (minimum-\$5), and Thank Offering. We had 14 units last year and would love to see that increase. I will be contacting the unit treasurer's in the fall to let you know if you need anything to complete your Five Star status.

(They all have to be opened as the bank will not accept rolls.) Please pay by check made out to UMW National. If you want a receipt have the address on the check or in an envelope with the check. You can bring your check to Conference Annual Day or mail it to Donna Speelman. Any other time that you contribute to the Legacy Fund, mail it directly to the New York address, which your treasurer should have.

I hope to see many of you at District and Conference Annual Days. It is always exciting to see and hear what other units and districts are doing to serve our Savior.
